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## 4-H Club Work

Superintendent: Michele Najar

Participation Requirements: Any regularly enrolled 4-H member who has satisfactorily completed his/her projects for the 2017-2018 club year may participate in the exhibits and contests pertaining to his/her projects. Articles to be exhibited must be made, raised, or collected during the current club year. Exhibits entered in the 4-H Department may not be entered in any other fair department. Leaders will be asked to certify completion of projects.

# MEMBERS MUST HAVE ENTRY FORMS IN TO THE COOPERATIVE EXTENSION OFFICE BY <u>AUGUST 31</u> in order to exhibit.

#### **GENERAL RULES**

See Greenlee County 4-H Rule Book, pages 2 and 4, for complete information.

Building exhibits are limited to a total of 50 entries per exhibitor. Exhibits will be released on Sunday of Fair weekend in accordance to the official Fair schedule. The Danish Grouping System\* will be used in judging 4-H Club exhibits. One Best of Fair ribbon will be awarded to the overall junior division winner, and one will be awarded to the overall senior division winner. These winners can be selected from any category.

No premium monies will be awarded by 4-H.

The Best of Fair Building Entry Buckle must be awarded to an individual; group entries are not eligible.

# **Cloverbuds**

4-H'ers who are enrolled in the Cloverbuds 4-H Program (5-8 year olds) may exhibit three items they have made or collected during the past 4-H year. Judging will be on a participatory level, with Cloverbud Ribbons awarded to all participants. These entries are not eligible for Danish Ribbons or Best of Fair classification.

# **CAKE DECORATING**

Members enrolled in the Cake Decorating Project may exhibit three items per class. Decorations must be entirely edible, except where noted. Cake does not have to be edible. Include recipe card for frosting, recipe should be on a 3x5 card: laminated, wrapped in plastic wrap, or placed in a plastic bag. All entries must be labeled on the center back with the following: name, age, and years in the 4-H Cake Decorating Project.

# **FOOD PREPARATION**

Members enrolled in the 4-H Food & Nutrition and/or Food Preservation projects may exhibit three items per class. All entries shall be on/in sturdy or hard disposable containers, and properly wrapped in plastic. No items requiring refrigeration will be accepted.

Cakes, pies, and breads shall be delivered whole. Cookies, brownies, muffins, rolls, and similar items shall be delivered in quantities of six (6). All entries must be properly labeled with the name of the food item and the recipe used to prepare the item. Food preservation projects must also include preservation method and processing times in the recipe. The Superintendent shall dispose of all items showing signs of spoilage during the run of the fair. All entries must be labeled on the center back with the following: name, age, and years in the Food & Nutrition or Food Preservation 4-H Projects.

The outside of jars must be washed and cleaned, and all rings removed, except for dried goods that do not have a pressure seal. Canned fruits and vegetables must be exhibited in standards pint or quart jars. Preserves, jams, conserve, relishes, and pickles may be exhibited in standard quart, pint, or half-pint jars. Jelly must be in standard jelly glasses with lids, or in standard half-pint or pint jars. Canned items will be judged by appearance- jars WILL NOT be opened.

# **PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEO**

# **PHOTOGRAPHY**

Members enrolled in the Photography Project may **enter six (6) single prints**. All entries must be selected from pictures taken as part of the current 4-H Club year's photography project. All entries must be creations of the 4-H member.

All photographs must be labeled on the back of the mat/poster board with member name, age, and years in the 4-H Photography Project.

Judges have the right to disqualify any entry that they determine to be out of category, does not comply with the rules, or is inappropriate for the 4-H exhibit.

NOTE: ANY PHOTOS ELIGIBLE FOR STATE FAIR: SEE STATE FAIR BOOK ENTRY INFORMATION

Advances in technology have created accessible ways to enhance and edit digital photographs. Techniques that can be performed in---camera or in a film darkroom are permissible in the "digital darkroom".

The difference between "enhancing" and "altering" a photograph is as follows:

- Enhancing: Editing to enhance the qualities of a photo is permitted. Examples include cropping, dodging, burning, contrast, and red eye reduction. Please note it is important to learn proper photographic techniques to produce better photographs out of the camera and thus reduce the need for editing.
- Altering: Editing to change the contents of a photo is not permitted. Examples include, but are not limited to: adding or removing a person from the shot, changing an expression. These rules pertain to all photography exhibits except Manipulated Images Class.

All entries must be labeled on the center back with the following: name, age, and years in 4-H photography project.

An exhibitor may enter each photo only once; therefore a photo entered in color cannot be entered in black and white.

# Acceptable photo sizes for Photo Entries:

Minimum size 4" X 6", maximum size 8" X 10". Must be printed on photo paper- NO EXCEPTIONS!

#### **PHOTO ENTRIES**

- Photos must be mounted and window matted on a complementary matte board to ensure the photo remains rigid when hung. The photo should be sandwiched between a backing (with suitable material that can support the photo, such as cardboard or
  - Corrugated board) and front matte with an opening large enough to show the picture accurately. All photos should be adequately secured to matting.
- 2. The matte board may be white, black, or of a color that accentuates the photograph effectively.
- Double window mats are strongly discouraged, as the thickness of the finished exhibit (over 1/8 inch thick) makes the photo difficult to display.
- 4. Do not use foam board or double matting.
- 5. Captions or titles should not be used.
- 6. Photos must not be framed. Framed photos will be disqualified.

# **VIDEO**

Members may enter three (3) distinct videos.

#### Video Requirements:

- 1. The video may be up to 5 minutes including titles and credits
- 2. Video submissions should be in English or provide English subtitles.
- 3. Do NOT violate copyright laws, especially in regards to music, photographs, and video clips.
- 4. Videos can be in any of the following formats: AVI, WMV, MOV, MPEG.
