## 2025 Navajo Nation Fair 4-H/FFA Junior Livestock Show & Sale

### General Rules and Regulations

**1. PURPOSE:** The 4-H/FFA Junior Livestock offers livestock animal projects both market and breeding in the following classes: swine, lamb, goat, and beef. All animals are raised by members of 4-H clubs and students of the Future Farmers of America (FFA) to encourage a practical interest among youth in the raising, caring, and feeding of livestock. Exhibitors, parents, 4-H leaders and sponsors are required to familiarize themselves with all General Rules and Regulations of the 2025 Navajo Nation Fair 4-H/FFA Junior Livestock Show & Sale.

**2. ENTRIES:** Please note specified entry deadline dates.

**ONLINE ENTRY DEADLINES WILL BE FRIDAY, AUGUST 1, 2025**

All entries will be submitted via FairEntry.

Large Animals, Small Animals, and Indoor Project entries will be accepted until 11:59 pm on August 1.

### **3. ENTRY FEES & PAYMENTS:**

All payments can be submitted via FairEntry.

Market Beef/Breeding Cattle: \$20.00 per head

Market Lamb/Goat/Swine/Breeding Sheep & Goats: \$15.00 per head

Small Animal: \$10.00 per animal (pens are one entry)

Pet Show: Free

Indoor Exhibits: Free

Showmanship: \$20.00 (Large Animal) \$10.00 (Small Animal)

**Late Entry- IF you fail to meet the deadline for entries, a late fee of \$50 will be required.**

#### **4. ENTRY LIMIT:**

Only (5) entries for Market Animals per exhibitor are permitted for the event. **IF you do not know which animals will be attending, you may enter more than the entry limit amount. However, you will pay for each entry.**

Example: 2 lambs, 2 steers, 1 swine or 2 lambs, 1 steer, 2 swine

#### **5. BREEDING CLASSES:**

Only one breeding animal per class, per exhibitor. Breeding animals cannot be entered as a market lamb.

There will be 4 classes with one overall grand champion and reserve grand champion.

Ewe (over 1 year)

Ram (over 1 year)

Ewe (under 1 year)

Ram (under 1 year)

**\*\*\*NEW THIS YEAR: RESERVATION BREEDING SHEEP CLASS\*\*\***

#### **6. ENTRIES/REGISTRATION:**

All entries for the 2025 Navajo Nation Jr. Livestock Show & Sale must be entered with appropriate animal information via FairEntry. All online entries must be complete by the specified due date unless other arrangements were made before late registration deadline.

**To be eligible to show at the 2025 Navajo Nation Jr. Livestock Show & Sale, members and project enrollment must be met by exhibitors in their enrolled county.**

#### **7. MEMBERSHIP:**

All exhibitors must be a member and in good standing of a 4-H club or FFA chapter and be 19 years and under in the current year. Any Native American/Alaska Native child is eligible to enter and exhibit (upon tribal enrollment verification). Non-native youth are eligible to show if they are a good standing member of a 4-H club or FFA chapter for a consecutive 2 years that is located on the Navajo Nation and has 50% or more Navajo participants. Record of membership and project must be available via check-in. Any inquiries regarding eligibility will be a committee decision as needed.

**ALL COMPETITIVE 4-H EXHIBITORS MUST BE ENROLLED IN AN ACTIVE 4-H CLUB, IN GOOD STANDING, AND ENROLLED IN THEIR RESPECTIVE PROJECT. RECORD BOOKS WILL BE CHECKED UPON ENTRY.**

## **8. AGE DIVISIONS:**

### **Booster: 8 & under**

Novice: 9-12 years old

Junior: 13-15 years old

Senior: 16-19 years old

## **9. LIVESTOCK IDENTIFICATION:**

All livestock must be identified in accordance with Navajo Nation Title 3. All livestock must have RFID (EID) tags and sheep/goats must have federal Scrapie Tag in addition to the RFID Tag, unless the Scrapie tag is also an RFID Tag. Any livestock without proper ID will not be permitted to show or sell. Bill of sale will be required as proof of ownership.

## **10. CAMPING:**

There will be available camping spots for the duration of the event at a first come, first serve basis. Please be mindful of all exhibitors in spacing of your camp. We need all exhibitors to have enough room for them and their families. There will be a camping fee determined by the Navajo Nation Fair Office. Please see coordinator at time of check-in for pass and cash payment. Please NOTE: these are dry camping spots.

## **11. CHECK IN:**

Wednesday, September 3, 2025, beginning at 8:00 AM for indoor exhibits and 2:00 PM for all animals. All livestock are to be checked in at the Navajo Nation Fairgrounds in Window Rock, AZ. Signage will be posted for location & scales. Please do not offload until you have gone through the Vet Check & Health Screening paperwork is completed. At time of check-in: Please have the following:

- a. Code of Conduct – exhibitors
- b. Livestock Hauling Papers
- c. Health Inspection Papers/Bill of Sale
- d. Project Record Books

## **12. WEIGH IN:**

Superintendent and Weight/Measurement officials will weigh all market animals. The weight measured will be the official weight, which will be used for the classification of market class divisions as well as official sale weight. All market animals will be weighed only 1 time.

Market Weight Requirements:

Lamb – 110 lbs

Beef – 1000 lbs

Swine – 220 lbs

Goat – 100 lbs

Exceptions: White Faced Sheep at 100 lbs. (only 3 or more will be its own class). Under special circumstances should the show have more than 3 entries of lambs classified as breeds other than black face. (Example: Speckled/Cross, Dorset, and/or South Downs) it will be considered an All-Other Breed (AOB) class. Should an animal not make weight requirement, the exhibitor will be allowed to show in a "Feeder Class" but cannot participate in the sale regardless of placing.

### **13. HEALTH INSPECTION:**

All livestock will be inspected by a veterinarian or assigned personnel to identify any visual signs of sickness, or communicable disease. Upon identifying illness or health issue the animal shall be prevented entry and/or removed immediately. Animals showing signs of sickness or disease during the duration of the show and sale will be disqualified. A veterinarian health inspection is REQUIRED for ALL participants. If the animal had ringworm, lesions must have dried, scabbed, and healed with hair/wool growing back in.

### **14. HAULING PERMIT(S):**

Hauling permits must accompany animal(s) when checking in at check-in station. Hauling permits can be obtained from your local Resource Enforcement Officer (Ranger), District Livestock Inspector, or State Brand Inspector. All livestock must have a Health Inspection done and entry permit number from the State of Arizona within 30 days of the show and sale. It is up to the livestock owner to be up to date with papers according to Navajo Nation laws. Please note requirements may be revised, changed, or enforced at any time pending Veterinarian recommendations and/or disease outbreak.

**OWNERSHIP:** All market animals exhibited in the Jr. Livestock Show & Sale must be owned the minimum number of days before the opening day of the event as follows:

Lamb/Goat/Swine: 180 days

Beed: 200 days

**TAG-INS:** Tags can be requested from the University of Arizona – Window Rock Extension Office until June 8, 2025. Unless other arrangements were made before the date. County tags will be honored from each respective county for entry. Failure to obtain tags by the deadline and failure to submit entry in the online system will result in not being allowed to show. If your county does not issue RFID tags, contact the Extension office to be issued and RFID tag to meet regulations.

### **15. RECORD BOOKS:**

Record books are required for each project entry for the 2025 event. Record books can also be submitted as an indoor exhibit entry.

### **16. STALLS & HOLDING PENS:**

Stall will be assigned at check-in after weigh-ins.

**SOLD ANIMALS:** Exhibitors who had livestock make sale will be instructed by Livestock Superintendent as to which pens their animal will be assigned, pending the Buyer's processing preference and delivery method.

### **17. MAINTENANCE & CARE:**

All exhibitors will be responsible for feeding, caring, showing, and the sale of all livestock during the duration of the event. Should the exhibitor or responsible party need to leave the grounds they must notify staff and designate another exhibitor or person to take care of the animal(s). The exhibitor is responsible for the care of their animal(s) until it is checked out or sent to the processor.

### **18. EXHIBITORS:**

All exhibitors will be expected to abide by all rules and regulations. Exhibitors who fail to abide by rules and regulations will be disqualified from competing and forfeiting all sales money to be donated to the Navajo Nation Jr. Livestock Account. Any disruption of sale, harassment or unethical conduct before, during, or after WILL NOT BE TOLERATED and will result in immediate disqualification of the exhibitor.

### **19. FITTING RULE:**

Participants must be present with their entry during any feeding, washing, grooming, or fitting as well as presenting their entry for show and sale. Anyone found in violation will be subject to immediate disqualification.

### **20. SHOWING OF ANIMALS:**

Participants must show their own animal in the show/sale. No one is permitted to assist an exhibitor in showing an animal unless prior approval from the committee is granted. Exceptions will be made if animals are in the same class. The helper must be a current 4-H member in good standing.

Booster exhibitors are allowed one person to help move the animal if needed but must be able to work their own animal for the judge.

### **21. SHOW DAY – SEPTEMBER 4, 2025:**

- a. Exhibitors are expected to be present during the show day and exhibit their own livestock. Should they have 2 animals in the same class they can ask any enrolled 4-H member in good standing to show on their behalf.
- b. Exhibitors should be familiar with tag numbers as this will be the method the Gate Stewards are using to identify the correct animal is being exhibited in the appropriate class. When class is called exhibitor shall provide the Gate Steward their name and tag number.
- c. Exhibitors will be given a back number that must be worn at all times during the show day.
- d. Both livestock and exhibitors are expected to be ready for their class or division and will be given notification of their class by the gate stewards. Due to the number of livestock participants the exhibitors will be given a first and second call to enter the ring, once the last call has been made and gate has closed, a “class complete” will be announced and no exhibitor will be allowed into the arena.

## **22. SALE DAY – SEPTEMBER 5, 2025:**

The 2025 Navajo Nation Jr. Livestock Sale will take place on Friday, September 6 starting at 10:00 AM. Sale order will be all grand and reserve champions first, continuing with placing of other animals from the show the previous day. This is a terminal sale.

- a. Exhibitors are expected to be present during the selling of their livestock entries unless prior arrangements have been made with the Superintendent with a reasonable excuse. Sale animals and exhibitors are expected to be ready to participate.
- b. All grand and reserve champion animals are required to sell and sent to processor. No exceptions. Any other animals may qualify for sale, based on placing and overall selling number.
- c. If an exhibitor decides they would like to pull their animal from sale, they must notify the superintendent an hour after the show event concludes on the 4<sup>th</sup> of September prior to the sale order being completed. **ALL GRAND AND RESERVE CHAMPIONS WILL SELL.**

## **23. POST SALE RELEASE:**

Following the sale, the exhibitor will be given instructions as to what they will do with their animal. Pens will be labeled for animals to be taken for processing. Once the exhibitor has released the animal to the appropriate location and checked out with the Sale Staff, they are free to continue their check out obligations.

## **24. EAR TAG & IDENTIFICATION:**

Ear tags from other counties, RFID tags, and Federal Scrapie ID Tags will remain in place to identify animals go to correct pens and final locations.

## **25. CHECK OUT:**

All livestock regardless of if they made the sale or not, are required to stay until Friday, September 5th, 2025, following the conclusion of the livestock sale. Exhibitors and livestock are not able to leave the premises without proper checkout paperwork to ensure the livestock leave with the appropriate parties including the sale animals. Prior to checking out exhibitors are required to clean their pens and any respective areas used for fitting or show/sale preparation.

## **26. SHOW DRESS CODE:**

Exhibitors are expected to dress appropriately for both the show and sale event. Preferred button up shirts, jeans, closed toe shoes (boots, loafers, etc.) are encouraged. No shortcuts, tank tops, and open toe shoes.



### **27. PAYOUTS/SALE PAYMENTS:**

All checks for sold animals will be made and dispensed once the buyers have paid the livestock committee. Please allow some time as we work with buyers and add-on supporters to ensure we are sending off one check and not multiple.

### **28. PROTESTS/GRIEVANCE:**

Should a complaint arise to any of the Junior Livestock Show & Sale activities, any individual can protest by submitting a detailed written document to the nature of the protest. The written protest must be accompanied by a \$50.00 money order. The complaint must be delivered to the Grievance Committee Chairperson prior to the sale. If the protest is ruled not in favor of the complainant, the protest fee is forfeited. Should the protest rule in favor of the complainant, the amount will be returned. The judging process will not be interrupted for a protest investigation. Depending on the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. Judges placing will be final.

### **29. CONDUCT/HARASSMENT:**

Any act of discourtesy, disobedience, and/or foul language to the 4-H/FFA Junior Livestock Show & Sales Committee and staff or any other 4-H/FFA affiliate by an exhibitor, parent, leader and/or sponsor will not be tolerated. The exhibitor(s) will be disqualified from all competition and the exhibitor(s) will forfeit all exhibits entered, entry fees, awards and potentially sales money. Any exhibitor, parent, 4-H leader and/or sponsor who attempts and/or interferes with the judge's performance of their duties or make false statements regarding any animal exhibited or interfere with the clerks, record books, of any competition will be subject of removal from the show and sale. Dismissal is determined by Grievance Committee.

### **30. LIABILITY:**

The 4-H/FFA Junior Livestock Show & Sale Committee and staff of the University of Arizona- Window Rock Extension Office, will not be responsible for any accidents, injury, illness and/or loss to all livestock, exhibitors, and/or parents. Exhibitors are recommended to carry their own liability insurance. The judges and the Grievance Committee reserve the right to disqualify and excuse any animal from entry and competition due to dangerous behavior, sickness, or lameness. The 4-H/FFA Junior Livestock Show & Sale Committee and staff of the University of Arizona- Window Rock Extension Office, will not be responsible for any livestock not sold in the sale and will not supplement and financial loss due to low selling animals.

### **31. SPECIAL AWARDS:**

**Showmanship Award:** The top showman out of each age division per species will be eligible to compete for the overall Supreme Showman. The showmanship judging will be conducted before each market class.

**Round Robin Showmanship:** Each supreme showmanship winner of each market class species (swine, lamb, goat, and beef) will be eligible for the Round Robin Showmanship Award. The overall showmanship champions of each Small Animal Division will compete for the Round Robin Showmanship Award separately.

**Herdsmanship Award:** This award is sponsored by the Francisco family to honor their late mother. They have their own committee and make their selection based off of observation and close watch of exhibitors who demonstrate good behavior outside of the show ring which includes the feeding, grooming, cleanliness, and other characteristics to win this award.

### **JUDGES AND JUDGING:**

**JUDGING SYSTEM:** The American System of judging will be used in all classes. The American System means the top 10 participants will receive a ribbon. Each participant thereafter will receive a participation ribbon.

**JUDGES DISCRETION:** All judge decisions are final and are at the sole discretion which are not limited to but include the following in competition; placing, classification, and age of animal allowing only a formal appeal as is indicated in the protest section below. All judges' placement and reasons will be displayed on the show platform.

## **JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE**

The Junior Livestock sale will be held Friday September 5, 2025, beginning at 10:00AM at the Lorene C. Lee Showring, in Window Rock, AZ. Grand and Reserve Champion are both REQUIRED to sell, all other animals that qualify for sale have the option to remain in the sale or pull their animal. Should the exhibitor decide to pull from the sale they have ONE HOUR following the conclusion of the show to notify the Livestock Coordinator.

EXAMPLE: If the 2<sup>nd</sup> place lamb exhibitor decides to pull from the sale, the 3<sup>rd</sup> place lamb of the class is eligible for sale in the livestock auction.

SALE ORDER: The sale order will begin with the grand and reserve grand at the beginning and follow with placements in the rest of the large animal show from the previous day.

### **LIMIT OF SALE ANIMALS PER EXHIBITOR IS ONE (1) PER SPECIES**

Example: One Grand Champion Steer, One Second Place Swine, 3<sup>rd</sup> Place Goat, 1<sup>st</sup> Place Lamb

**LAMB DIVISION SALE:** Only the top two (2) of each weight class including the Grand and Reserve Champion will be eligible for sale. Total number of lambs sold will be determined when classes are made. There is no maximum weight for lambs.

### **Booster Division Sale: Only the Grand and Reserve Champion will be eligible for sale.**

**BEEF DIVISION SALE:** Only the top placed steer in each class including the Grand and Reserve Champions will be eligible for sale. For a total of five (5) Market Beef being sold. Beef will be sold on a per pound basis with a maximum weight of 1250 pounds.

**SWINE DIVISION SALE:** Only the top two (2) from each weight class including the Grand and Reserve Champions will be eligible for sale. For a total of eight (8) Market Swine will be sold on a per pound basis with a maximum weight of 265 pounds.

**GOAT DIVISION SALE:** Only the top two (2) from each weight class, including the Grand and Reserve Champions will be eligible for sale. For a total of four (4) will sell in the auction, sold on a per pound basis with a minimum weight of 50 pounds.

The Livestock Committee and Extension staff have the right to amend the number of sale animals pending circumstances that may arise.

All sold market animals will go directly to the processor. The state laws of Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, Colorado and the Navajo Nation regulate out-of- state transportation of livestock into and out of Arizona and the Navajo Nation. Any market animal that has been sold in a previous event cannot be entered into the market class at the 2025 Navajo Nation Jr Livestock Show & Sale. Should an animal place Grand or

Reserve Champion in any class, they CANNOT be shown at any other concurrent show and must be sold during the sale. This is a terminal sale, the animal is not allowed to enter another show after.

**Contingency/ Support fund:** We will be deducting a percentage from the sales amount to maintain the contingency fund for the Jr. Livestock Committee. The percentage deducted is as follows:

Market Lambs, Swine, Goats, and Beef are at 3%.

The amount will be shown once checks have been made out, to reflect the sale amount, contingency deduction, and any added-on monies within the Livestock Sales Receipt.

**Checks will be mailed out after ALL BUYERS have paid.**

## **Junior Livestock Show & Sale Committees Job**

### **Descriptions**

**Livestock Committee (Large/Small Animal Superintendents):** Coordinate all aspects of the show from the arrival of the exhibitors to the completion of the event. Specifically coordinating with the other committee members to ensure the show & sale run accordingly.

**Livestock: Check out & Release Committee:** The committee will organize all needed paperwork for proper check out and release of each animal participating in the event. The committee will consist of Livestock Superintendents and volunteers.

**Auction-Sale Committee:** Coordinate the Junior Livestock Sale and Pay-outs. They will set up the sale platform, carry out the lottery draw for sale listing.

**Grievance Committee:** Responsible of reviewing all written complaints/protests that properly follow the protest/grievance process procedures. They will apply all General Rules, Junior Livestock Rule & Regulations, to the protest submitted. The committee will review and ethically review the information to decide on the action to be taken to address the Grievance/Protest in a 2/3 vote. See Protest Section for fees associated with Grievance/Protest Process.

### Special Rules: SWINE

I. See General Rules & Regulations

II. PSEUDO-RABIES REQUIREMENTS: All swine must be from a pseudorabies. Validate and certified her or be tested negative for pseudorabies prior to transportation to the fair. YOU MUST FURNISH EITHER THE PAPERS OR PROOF OF TESTING. At check-in, you must hold Swine in trailer for inspection by the Veterinarian and respective superintendent.

III. Swine entered into the Market Swine classes may be Gilts or Barrows

IV. Market Swine will be weighed in during check in, this will be the Official Weight for classification
