7-10-6 BRALLIAR, FLOYD BURTON (Dr.) - b. Richland, Keokuk Co., Iowa, Sept. 11, 1875, six children.

Dr. Floyd has become quite distinguished and noted in the fields of education and science. He has received degrees as follows: B.S. at Walla Walla College, College Place, Washington in 1895; M.S. at Emmanuel Missionary College, Berrien Springs, Mich. in 1919; Ph. D. (agricultural biology) at George Peabody College for Teachers, Nash-ville, Tenn. in 1921.

He taught school in Iowa after graduating from Walla Walla College until 1903, when he became Professor of Pedagogy at Union College Nebraska. In 1904 he was appointed Superintendent of Education, Seventh Day Adventist Church Schools, and in 1905 principal and business manager of the Iowa Industrial Academy. From 1909 to 1917 he was principal of the Hillcrest School Farm, and from 1917 to 1947 professor of biology at Nashville Agricultural Normal Institute, later Madison College, Nashville, Tenn., in additional to serving as Dean of that school from 1932 to 1940, and vice-president from 1940 to 1947. Since 1947 he has been Emeritus Professor of Madison College.

He was a lecturer, School Assembly Assoc. Society of Florists, vice-president Bee-Keepers Association, vice-president Iris Society for South, member Tennessee State Florist Assoc., Iowa State Horticultural Society. Tennessee State Horticultural Society.

He specialized in plant breeding and testing; suitability of grapes for general culture in states of Old South.




























































































































