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Arizona 4-H Horse Presentation Contest Rules

(This contest is a Qualifier for Western National Roundup)

The primary objective of these contests is to provide an opportunity for youth enrolled in Equine related projects such as Horse, Horseless Horse, Equine Science and Vet Science to demonstrate the breadth of their knowledge and understanding of equine science and management as a forum to express their knowledge through public speaking.

Age Divisions:

Junior – 8-10 Years Old
Intermediate – 11-13 Years Old
Senior – 14-19 Years Old

Age Divisions will be determined by age as of 1/1/2026.

Rules:

- Subject matter must pertain to the horse industry. Demonstrations or presentations not appropriately related to the horse industry can be disqualified at the discretion of the judge(s).
- Contestants may participate in this contest as an individual or team of two. Team and individual presentations will be judged on the same criteria and will be competing against one another (there are not separate team and individual categories). To qualify for Western National Roundup, both members of a team must be Seniors.
- Contestants shall be in Official 4-H Dress or Business Casual.
- The presentation may be a demonstration or illustrated talk. All references to the term “presentation” in these rules include either demonstration or illustrated talk. A demonstration is defined as a presentation of a step by step procedure with an end product or result. An illustrated talk is defined as a presentation of an idea or topic that uses visual aids to convey the message. Both presentation forms are acceptable and will be evaluated equally, although the delivery methods are different as defined above. Both should utilize visual aids to help convey the major points of the presentation and more than one type of visual aid is preferable. Visual aids may include, but are not limited to: handouts, posters, props, videos, slides, and computer generated media. No live animals may be used.
- Creative audio visual aids may be used, but the contestant must be involved in the making or designing them.
- Contestants are responsible for bringing equipment (including all necessary computer cords), supplies and visual aids. Special arrangements for equipment must be made with the Superintendent prior to the contest.
- Contestants may use notes. However, excessive use of notes may be counted against the contestant. This will be at the discretion of the judges.
- A public address system will not be used, but an easel, podium and table will be provided.

- During the competition the contestants may introduce themselves by name, club and presentation topic.
- Contestants should cite their major reference materials as part of their presentation, but this will not be counted in the allotted time.
- Only the judge(s) may ask questions of the contestant. Question time will not be counted in the allotted time.
- Contestant order will be determined by a random drawing the morning of the contest.
- Ties will be broken by the judges.
- Only videography or pictures of your contestant is allowed. All participant speeches may be filmed or photographed by contest officials with individual consent.
- Once an individual or team has started their demonstration (in this case it is after they have been introduced by the superintendent), they may not receive assistance from any coach, parent, audience member, or other person, which includes, but is not limited to, the stroking of any key on a computer, other audio visual device, holding posters, demo props, etc. Violating this rule is disqualification. However, the Superintendent may assist Junior members if a problem occurs with audio visual equipment or visual aids.

Time Limits:

- Seniors - Presentations must be at least 10 minutes in length, but no longer than 15 minutes.
- Intermediates - Presentations must be at least 5 minutes in length, but no longer than 10 minutes.
- Juniors - Presentations must be at least 3 minutes in length, but no longer than 8 minutes.
- Participants will be given a 30 second reminder before the minimum time is met and a 30 second warning before the end of time period.
- Time for answering questions and citing sources is not counted in the presentation length.
- One point will be deducted for each minute or fraction of a minute under or over the time limits.

Awards:

- Each Contestant will be awarded based on the Danish System. Blue Awards will be given to those who exceed expectations. Red Awards will be given to those who meet expectations. White Awards will be given to those who do not meet expectations.
- Each age division may have one champion

- Only the judge(s) may ask questions of the contestant. Question time will not be counted in the allotted time. Contestant should repeat the question then answer it.
- Contestant order will be determined by a random drawing and announced at the beginning of the contest.
- Ties will be broken by judge(s).
- For educational purposes the management may videotape all speeches with individual consent. No other videography or pictures are allowed except for your own contestant.

- Speeches must be a new topic and material each year.
- The contestants and audience will be present for speeches.

Time Limits:

- Seniors - Speeches must be at least 6 minutes in length, but no longer than 8 minutes.
- Intermediates - Speeches must be at least 3 minutes in length, but no longer than 6 minutes.
- Juniors - Speeches must be at least 2 minutes in length, but no longer than 4 minutes.
- Participants will be given a 30 second reminder before the minimum time is met and a 30 second warning before the end of time period.
- Time for answering questions is not counted in the speech length.
- Two points will be deducted for each 30 seconds over or under the time limit by each of the judges. The speech time limit will begin once the contestant begins to speak after being introduced by the contest superintendent.

Awards:

- Each Contestant will be awarded based on the Danish System. Blue Awards will be given to those who exceed expectations. Red Awards will be given to those who meet expectations. White Awards will be given to those who do not meet expectations.
- Each age division may have one champion.

(This contest is a Qualifier for Western National Roundup)

An impromptu speech is a speech that you have to make when you haven't prepared the topic in advance.

Age Divisions:

Junior – 8-10 Years Old

Intermediate – 11-13 Years Old

Senior – 14-19 Years Old

Age Divisions will be determined by age as of 1/1/2026.

Only Seniors may qualify for Western National Roundup

Rules:

- Contestants shall be in Official 4-H Dress or Business Casual.
- Contestants may only participate in this contest as an individual.
- Contestants will select a topic for their speech by randomly drawing three questions from a pool of questions. They will select one question and return the other two. A maximum of one minute will be allowed for this process. Questions will be relative to today's youth and may include current events, 4-H, and/or social issues. Examples of the type of questions include:
 - If I were an author, I would write about...
 - One issue facing teenagers today is...
 - If I could describe my personality as a tree, which tree would I be...
 - What has being involved in 4-H taught me?
- Questions will be at the discretion of the Superintendent. Only the Superintendent will know the questions prior to the contest. No two contestants will speak on the same topic in the same year.
- Contestants will be allowed 3 minutes to organize their thoughts before beginning their presentation. Time will begin when they select their question.
- Contestants will be allowed to organize their thoughts on a 5x7 blank note card (supplied). However, excessive use of notes may be counted against the contestant. This will be at the discretion of the judges.
- Contestants may not use any costumes, posters, visual aids, or props for their presentations.
- Contestants are not allowed to present any items to the judges.
- A public address system will not be used, but a podium will be provided which may or may not be used.
- Contestant order will be determined by a random drawing and announced at the beginning of the contest.

- Ties will be broken by judge(s).
- For educational purposes the management may videotape all speeches with individual consent. No other videography or pictures are allowed except for your own contestant.
- The contestants and audience will be present for speeches.

Time Limits:

- Seniors - Speeches must be at least 3 minutes in length, but no longer than 5 minutes.
- Intermediates - Speeches must be at least 2 minutes in length, but no longer than 4 minutes.

Arizona 4-H Creed Speaking Contest Rules

(This contest is NOT a Qualifier for Western National Roundup)

The purpose of the Creed Speaking Contest is to develop the ability of members to demonstrate their interpretation and self-expression of the 4-H Creed.

Age Divisions:

Junior – 8-10 Years Old
Intermediate – 11-13 Years Old
Senior – 14-19 Years Old

Age Divisions will be determined by age as of 1/1/2026.

Rules:

- Contestants shall be in Official 4-H dress or Business Casual.
- Member will present the National 4-H Creed completely from memory.
- Each participant shall begin the presentation by stating "The National 4-H Creed." Each participant shall end the presentation with the statement, "...dedicate my efforts to their fulfillment. Thank you." Additional introductory or concluding remarks will be penalized.
- Participants will be asked questions directly related to the 4-H Creed following their presentation. Questions will be formulated by the event judges.
- The event will be a timed activity with two minutes for presentation. After two minutes, participants will be penalized 1 point for each 15 seconds over time.
- Participants will be scored on their general appearance, projection to the audience, voice control, pronunciation and enunciation, accuracy, overall presentation and answers to questions.
- Event officials will randomly determine the speaking order.
- A public address system will not be used, but a podium will be provided which may or may not be used.
- One point will be deducted for each added or deleted word. A reader, other than the judge(s), will be used to check the wording and determine mistakes.
- A contestant may ask for the next word to be given to them, by stating "Word", but an additional point will be deducted, making that one word a deduction of 2 points.
- Only the judge(s) may ask questions of the contestant. Question time will not be counted in the allotted time. Contestant should repeat the question then answer it.
- Ties will be broken by judges.

- Only videography or pictures of your contestant is allowed. All participant speeches may be filmed or photographed by contest officials with individual consent.
- The contestants will be held in a holding room during other contestant presentations. The purpose of the Art and Photography Show is to give members a chance to highlight their non-verbal communication skills.

Divisions: All artwork will be judged in one of 9 divisions. Each “Age Division” will have three “Art Divisions”.

Age Divisions:

Junior – 8-10 Years Old

Intermediate – 11-13 Years Old

Senior – 14-19 Years Old

Age Divisions will be determined by age as of 1/1/2026.

Art Divisions:

2D Art

3D Art

Photography

Show Rules:

- Members may enter 5 pieces of artwork total, but those 5 entries can be any combination of divisions. *(Examples: All 5 entries in Photography or 2 entries in 2D Art, 1 entry in 3D Art and 2 entries in Photography)*
- Artwork can be anything that the exhibitor considers art. Including but not limited to acrylics, ceramics, charcoal, digital illustration, drawing, fiber art, metalwork, mixed media, oils, pastel or chalk, pen or ink wash, photography, sculpture, watercolor, or woodwork.
- All entries must be original works and not previously shown in an Arizona State 4-H Art Show.
- No kits, patterns, prints or copies are allowed.
- Show organizers reserve the right to turn away any submissions that it deems inappropriate or offensive in subject matter including works with overtly pornographic, discriminatory or violent messages.

- Artwork must be completely dry at time of submission.
- All entries must be labeled on the back or bottom with the name and age of the exhibitor.
- Two-dimensional work, 2D Art, should be attached to a mat board leaving a border around the outer edge. Artwork can be framed but must be wire hung. 2D Art should be no larger than 16" x 20".
- Three dimensional work, 3D Art, will be displayed on a table and should be secure enough to withstand minor table movement. 3D Art should not be taller than 3'.
- Photography should be mounted securely to black or white mat board, leaving a border around the outer edge. Photos must be no smaller than 5" X 7" and no larger than 16" X 20".
- Frames with sawtooth hangers will **not** be able to be displayed.
- Judging is closed to the public. It shall be at the sole discretion of the judges whether the entries are awarded Blue, Red, or White Awards or Best of Show Rosettes. No division or class may be reopened after the judging is finished.
- Any artwork will need to be picked up at the end of the day. Event organizers should be notified if someone other than the exhibitor will be picking up the artwork.

Awards:

- Each Contestant will be awarded based on the Danish System. Blue Awards will be given to those who exceed expectations. Red Awards will be given to those who meet expectations. White Awards will be given to those who do not meet expectations.

Parliamentary Procedure is the process for proposing, amending, approving and defeating legislative motions. This contest is a written test that will test each contestant's knowledge of parliamentary procedure. To qualify to represent Arizona at Western National Roundup, Seniors will also have an oral presentation on a given topic.

Age Divisions:

Junior – 8-10 Years Old

Intermediate – 11-13 Years Old

Senior – 14-18 Years Old

Age Divisions will be determined by age as of 1/1/2026.

**Only Seniors may qualify for Western National Roundup*

Written Test:

- A 25-question written test will be given to each contestant.
- Each question will be multiple choice and worth 2 points.
- Each age division will have a different test.

Oral Presentation:

- Only seniors wishing to qualify for the Western National Roundup, should prepare an oral presentation.
- Contestants will give a short presentation about this year's topic: Officer Roles and Responsibilities. During the presentation, the contestants will be judged on: their oral presentation skills, the content of their oral presentation, and their knowledge of parliamentary procedure. The presentation should be in the following format:
 - Name and club or county
 - Two minutes or less presentation about this year's topic: Officer Roles and Responsibilities. Contestant can present on any aspect of the topic. There is not enough time to present about the entire topic.
 - For example: a presentation on the role of the president during a meeting or how to prepare an agenda.
- Contestants may use notes. However, excessive use of notes may be counted against the contestant. This will be at the discretion of the judge(s).
- A public address system will not be used, but a podium will be provided.

Scoring:

- The written test will be worth 2 points for each question (50 points total).
- The oral presentation will be worth 100 points.
- Ties will be broken by the judges.

Arizona 4-H Performing Arts Showcase Rules

(This is **NOT** a Qualifier for Western National Roundup)

The purpose of the Performing Arts Showcase is to allow members the opportunity to display their performing arts skills in a non-competitive environment..

Rules:

- This is a showcase, not a competition. No awards will be given.
- Acts may include (but not limited to) singing, dancing, instrumental music, skits, magic, comedy, martial arts, juggling, NO LIP-SYNCHING
- Each performer is permitted only one entry into the showcase, unless they are also a part of a group performance.
- Students who are part of a group act should indicate the group on the registration form. Each member of the group should register separately.
- Recommended length is 3 minutes; acts must be no more than 5 minutes.
- The act must have no fire, profanity, sex, nudity or violence and must be safe for the performers. (*No danger acts*)
- Costumes must be respectful, tasteful and appropriate for all age groups.
- Acts are responsible for their own props and costumes.
- If the act requires recorded accompanying music, the music must be emailed as an mp3 file to gabrielsonv@arizona.edu.
- Acts will be asked to show their performance to an event organizer or 4-H Agent to determine appropriateness.
