Learn How to Garden in the Desert and Become a Master Gardener

The **Master Gardener Training Course** is a 17-week study of the science and art of growing plants in Pinal County.

Materials will include the Master Gardener manual and links to supporting documentation for each class.

Classes will run from October 6, 2021 through February 16, 2022 on Wednesday mornings from 9 AM – Noon

The weekly classes will be presented online via Zoom, with a potential for four of the classes, locally, in-person classes.

Cost is \$150 per person or \$225 per couple if sharing materials.
