

4-H Program Year: October 1 - September 30

GENERAL RULES

Any regularly enrolled 4-H member who has satisfactorily completed their projects for the 2023-2024 club year may participate in the exhibits and contests pertaining to their projects.

1. All participants must attend at least 75% of community club and project meetings to be classified as a member in good standing. Club by-laws will take precedents if they are above these requirements.
2. Participants must have been enrolled in a 4-H Project (minimum 6 hours) related to the exhibit being entered by July 31st of the 4-H year and the 4-H Project must be completed and signed-off by the participants club leader by September 13th, 2024 of the 4-H program year.
3. Participants may exhibit any number of items), except **Photography which is limited to fifteen (15) entries.**
4. All participants must complete a project record book for each project area, and a 4-H Self Evaluation Form for the year.
5. Articles to be exhibited must be made, raised, or collected during the current club year.
6. Exhibits entered in the 4-H Departments may not be entered in any other fair department.
7. 4-H volunteers will be asked to certify the completion of projects.
8. Copyrighted materials and designs may not be used in an exhibit that is presented as an original work by the participant. Exhibits must include permission from the copyright holder/owner to use copyrighted material(s). Exhibits without this permission cannot be displayed. For exhibits using material(s)/design(s) that are not original, participants must give proper credit to the original source of all materials/designs used in the exhibit.
9. If a participant is using a kit of any kind (Lego, quilting, etc.), it must be noted on the display and accredited.
- 10. All judges' decisions are final.**

IMPORTANT AGE DIVISION TERM DEFINITIONS:

Cloverbuds: 5-7 years of age by January 1 of the current 4-H program year. Can only enroll in 4-H Cloverbuds.

Junior 4-H Member: 8-10 years of age by January 1 of the current 4-H program year.

Intermediate 4-H Member: 11 to 13 years of age by January 1 of the current 4-H program year.

Senior 4-H Member: 14-18 years of age by January 1 of the current 4-H program year. *Senior members cannot have passed their 19th birthday prior to January 1 of the current program year.*

MEMBERS MUST ENTER ONLINE BY SEPTEMBER 13th.

Entry System will open August 16th and close at **10PM on September 13th, 2024.**

CHAMPION BUILDING EXHIBITOR AWARD: For the Champion Building Exhibitor Award, the participant's top six (6) projects will be taken from three (3) different divisions. Only top awards Grand/Reserve and blue ribbons will be counted. The participant will only have four (4) projects from one division go towards their Champion Building Exhibitor Award.

4-H STORE: The 4-H Store will be available on Sunday, September 29th from 3:00-4:00pm (tentative) in the 4-H Building. Sale tags must be placed on the items before being put on display on Wednesday September 25th. On Sunday morning, a silent auction sheet will be placed next to the items for sale. **4-H participants must be present to sell their exhibits and collect money.**

CLOVERBUDS DEPARTMENT

4-H members who are enrolled in the Cloverbuds 4-H Program (5–7-year-olds), may exhibit items they have made or collected during the current 4-H year. Cloverbud Ribbons will be awarded to all participants. These are exhibits for our youngest members. The emphasis is on participation, learning and teamwork, not competition. These entries are not eligible for Danish Ribbons or Grand/Reserve Champion classification.

BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES

4-H youth participants explore the broad scope of biological science through real-life scenarios and educational opportunities about life and living processes. They learn about topics such as aquatic science, entomology, apiculture (beekeeping), meat and food science, poultry science, embryology, and veterinary science. Entomology exhibits in this division will be judged on correctness of identification, labeling, and mounting according to 4-H manuals. **Horticulture exhibits will include a typed 3x5 card wrapped in plastic wrap or placed in a plastic bag that indicates the variety of the exhibit. For example: "Jack-o-lantern" Pumpkin, "Gala" Apples, etc.**

CLOTHING AND TEXTILES

Clothing & Fashion – An exhibit that shows learning about style, fashion, design, thrifty spending, wardrobe planning, types of fabrics, and clothing care. Exhibits may include constructed or purchased clothing and accessories. All garments are to be on clothes hangers.

Sewing – An exhibit that shows learning and skill in sewing, the use and care of fabrics and fibers, or the construction of clothing and other items. All garments are to be on clothes hangers.

Needle Arts – An exhibit that shows learning and skill in knitting, crocheting, stitchery, or other needle arts.

Quilting – An exhibit that shows learning and skill in quilting. Items may be pieced, appliqué, foundation or paper pieced. Quilting may be hand or machine done or tied. In some exhibits, no-sew appliqué techniques are appropriate.

4-H Poster – Special poster exhibit to visually tell a story or idea about 4-H to the general public.

Communication – An exhibit that shows learning about written, oral, and visual communication skills in their many forms.

Creative Writing – Typically fiction or poetry that displays imagination or invention.

Digital Story Telling – An exhibit that shows learned skill in digital story telling through video, slide show, etc.

Provide a brief description of the project on a sheet of paper including a QR Code linking to the digital project.

Health & Nutrition - An exhibit that shows learning through eating healthy foods, including safety practices, physical activity.

FOOD PREPARATION & CAKE DECORATING

An exhibit that shows learning through cooking, baking, eating, and choosing healthy foods, including safety practices. 4-H members are encouraged to exhibit food items that utilize skills learned in the project

FOOD PREPARATION

Participants must **submit the recipe** for each entry, recipe should be typed and on a 3x5 card wrapped in plastic wrap or placed in a plastic bag. Any entry that does not include the recipe will not be eligible for Grand and Reserve Champion honors. If an exhibit has been frozen this should be indicated and reasons given; freezing will affect products if not done properly so use caution.

Quality of Food Exhibits

Each food item entered should be of high-quality standards and attractively prepared. Foods exhibited in this division **MUST NOT** contain perishable fillings or toppings such as: Creams, Eggs, Custard, Meat, Meat and Vegetable Combinations. The judges can disqualify any product in this division that does not meet food safety standards. Any product not meeting specifications will be

for exhibition only and will receive a participation ribbon. Foods requiring refrigeration will not be accepted.

All exhibits must be on rigid cardboard or strong paper plates (candy, cookies, muffins, or brownies - 5 per plate) and covered with a Ziploc type bag. DO NOT PUT BREAD INTO ZIPLOC TYPE BAGS, place the entire, uncut loaf on rigid cardboard or a paper plate and cover it in plastic wrap.

CAKE DECORATING

Include recipe card for frosting, recipe should be on a 3x5 card wrapped in plastic wrap or placed in a plastic bag. Decorating techniques may be presented on a cake pan, foam cake, foil covered board, cupcake, or baked cake.

FOOD PRESERVATION

Plates must be covered with a Ziploc bag. **All entries must be labeled as to the contents, dates when canned, canning method (water bath or pressure), and recipe used.** Jar caps and rings should be clean, not sticky, and without rust. Contents except for meats should be covered by liquid and should not touch lid. A proper seal is important.

PHOTOGRAPHY

4-H Members enrolled in the Photography Project may enter **up to fifteen (15) single prints in this division**. All entries must be selected from pictures taken as part of the current 4-H Club year's photography project. All entries must be creations of the 4-H member.

Acceptable photo sizes for Single Photo Entries:

5x7 and 8x10 are the **only acceptable sizes for single photo entries**.

PHOTO ENTRIES

Photos must be mounted, and window matted on a complementary matte board to ensure the photo remains rigid when hung. The photo should be sandwiched between a backing and front matte with an opening large enough to show the picture accurately. All photos should be adequately secured to matting.

Photographs may be mounted horizontally or vertically, at the discretion of the 4-H member, as determined by the photograph.

Captions or titles should not be used.

The maximum print size is 8x10 inches; maximum matte and frame size is 12x14 inches.

All entries must be labeled on the center back with the following: type of camera used, and printing process used (by home printer, print shop, web service, etc.). A participant may enter each photo only once; therefore, a photo entered in color cannot be entered in black and white, enhanced digital photography or on a poster or storyboard.

Color Photography

Only basic editing to enhance the qualities of a photo. Examples include cropping, dodging, burning, contrast, brightness, saturation, and red eye reduction.

Altered Photography

Editing to change the contents of a photo. Examples include any form of AI, adding a sunset, or removing a person from the shot. On the back of each photo, the original photo must be placed and a 3'x5' card must list the software used and a list of what was done to the photo.

Black & White Photography

Photos in the Black & White category can be taken in Black & White mode on the camera, on Black & White Film, or modified from color to Black & White. On the back of each photo, the technique should be listed and the original photo if it was modified from color to black & white along with the software used.
