STEPS TO REGISTER: Registration is from <u>APRIL 8th to the 14th **</u> <u>This is for INDOOR, SMALL STOCK, MARKET, BREEDING AND DAIRY. ALL ENTRIES THAT</u> <u>ARE PARTICIPATING MUST FOLLOW THE BELOW INSTRUCTIONS AND ENTER ONLINE</u>

1. Register April 8-14 20201 at waltonwebcasting.com - click Cyber Livestock Show where you will see the EXPO logo and our Cyber Show

2. You will fill out exhibitor & animal information, as well as upload your video into the entry form.

3. Videos must be taken during the entry time frame. Old video footage will not be accepted.

4. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to upload the entry form by the last day of the entry deadline, no refunds will be provided if the deadline is missed.

5. Try not to wait until the last minute to sign up. We review for quality & the sooner you upload your video the more time you will have for corrections.

6. The show will be available online at waltonwebcasting.com or the Walton Webcasting Facebook Page!

7. WWC is not responsible for non-viewing of poor quality, 4K videos or vertically filmed videos.

8. Check the website for any Rule updates.

9. Attached are some videos with examples of how to record a video of the participant and animal. These videos will be used for conformation and showmanship.

10. Proper 4-H and FFA attire must be worn in videos.

11. **INDOOR** selling in the auction must enter at the same time with a still picture not a video. 12. SMALL STOCK AND LARGE LIVESTOCK MUST SUBMIT VIDEOS PLEASE VISIT THE WEBSITE TO WATCH PREVIOUS SHOWS TO LEARN THE EXPECTATIONS RELATED TO YOUR SPECIFIC ANIMAL

13. There will be a toggle switch to choose your showmanship video. Please follow the attached rules from the premium book

Showmanship Rules and Regulations All Exhibitors must participate in showmanship. All market entries must use their market entry in showmanship competition; however if the exhibitor does not have a market entry, they may use their prospect or breeding entry for showmanship; both divisions compete together.

- · Senior (age 14 18)
 - Junior (age 8 to 13)
- **FFA Members** may exhibit at the Yavapai County EXPO Show and Sale through their senior year of high school.

14.INDOOR DISPLAYS WILL ONLY BE IN THE AUCTION NOT THE SHOW, please contact the Indoor Superintendent with any questions or concerns.

What are the video requirements? **INDOOR IS STILL PHOTO ONLY**

- 1. No 4K videos. 1080p only (your phone automatically films in 1080p).
- 2. Phone MUST be held SIDEWAYS (horizontally).
- 3. Showman should be dressed in 4-H or FFA show attire.
- 4. Videos should be roughly 60 seconds.

5. Videos are to be uploaded directly from the device that the video was recorded on. Texting/ emailing video compromises the quality.

6. No editing is allowed. Must be a continuous video, with no stopping and restarting. -No zooming in and out.

7. In no particular order: a chest, side, and rear view shot should be provided. If an angle is missing it could cost advancing to the next round.

8. Refer to the tutorial videos on our website waltonwebcasting.com Cyber Livestock Show page before filming your animal.

9. Videoing outside on level ground is best.

10. Sound will not be used so the cameraman can talk to the showman while videoing.

What will happen after the entries are submitted?

Continue to take care of your project as weigh in will be as stated in the Premium Book on APRIL 21, 2021 from 9am - 4pm. While we are waiting patiently the producers at Walton Webcasting will continue to review the videos and build the show.

What about weigh in?

Weigh-in:

Each market animal and/or meat pen will be weighed-in from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. on designated day. See EXPO Dates and Deadlines. Animals will be placed in classes after weighing in on the official scale at check-in.

1. Large livestock market entries that do not make minimum weight as specified in their market division will be automatically entered in the prospect/feeder class for that species. Though ineligible for auction, prospect/feeder animals are eligible for showmanship classes.

2. In disputed cases, exhibitors may request a re-weigh, provided the animal has not left the scale area (defined as the area under tent). **There will be no forced watering or feeding allowed.** No wet animals, unshorn lambs, or blankets of any kind will be allowed on animals as they are weighed.

3. Members are responsible for calculating shrinkage on their market animals.

When will the show be?

The Show will run live on Friday April 22, 2021. This show will mimic the EXPO live show as close as it can in a virtual world. Please watch a show at waltonwebcasting.com to grow your skill set related to how the videos should be made. Coconino County Fair used this same company last year and can be viewed at https://www.cyberstockshow.tv/previous-shows

This is a bracket style show. Brackets can be broken up by breed, sex and or date of birth. All judging takes place at the Walton Webcasting studio in Walton, Indiana with live commentary throughout the entirety of the webcast.

What about the Auction?

The Auction will be on Saturday as previously scheduled. It will be an ONLINE event through Walton Webcasting. They are in the process of creating a link we can give the buyers. CLOVERBUD ACTIVITIES

Natural Resources



Let's identify seeds using a handy seed chart.

Materials:

White Paper Plate Ruler

Glue

Markers

8 Kinds of Seeds (Example: Bean, Pea, Spinach, Corn, Radish, and Cucumber)

Procedure:

- 1. Divide the paper plate into eighths, like a pie. First divide the plate in half, then in fourths, followed by eighths. Draw lines using a marker and a ruler.
- 2. In each segment, glue a seed, label it, and draw a picture of the vegetable.

It's now time to plant some seeds!

Materials: Seeds (leftover from the handy seed chart) Potting Soil Paper Egg Carton Water



Procedure:

- 1. Remove the lid from the egg carton and fill each section about $\frac{3}{4}$ full with potting soil.
- 2. Place the seeds in the soil according to the package directions.
- 3. Place the egg carton in a location of natural light and water the seeds regularly.
- 4. Watch your garden grow! As the seedlings get larger,

transplant them into your garden or larger pots by cutting the egg carton segment and planting the whole part in the ground.
