March was the 6-month mark for my tenure as the Yavapai 4-H agent. It has been a steep learning curve for me and I want to thank you all for your patience as I grapple with learning the history of Yavapai 4-H, needs, hopes and dreams.

My plan for my first year has been to 1) get to know my diligent and dedicated club leaders, project leaders, and 4-H members in person and 2) start and complete a needs assessment to inform a strategic plan tailored to Yavapai County 4-H.

This has been hampered by the COVID agenda somewhat. I had to resort to secondary data: record books, reports, financial records, and zsuite. I also have had the pleasure of meeting some folks in the office when we were open and even got in a few interviews.

Now that our office is open I want to jumpstart my plan by visiting with each Club team and attending some club meetings. I'll return as much as I need to capture your thoughts and visions.

So, please know that I will be calling you soon to arrange for our visit. We can provide pizza and drinks for the leadership meeting. I won't disrupt you club meeting with the kids any more than for introductions and the small "vote with your feet" activity.

Thank you for taking the time to read my letter. I'll be in touch. Together we will continue to build Yavapai County 4-H.

Swine Project Starter Grants

The Arizona Pork Council is pleased to announce the Swine Project Starter Grant. This Grant was developed to allow FFA and 4-H Youth an opportunity to participate within the swine industry. \$500 will be awarded to 20 youth participating in their 1st Swine Project to be used towards the purchase of the pig.

Applicants MUST complete <u>the google form application</u> AND submit an essay OR video explaining the need for this grant and how your future will be impacted by participating in a Swine Project. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

8- to 10-year-old applicants will submit a 250-word essay OR 2-minute video
11- to 13-year-old applicants will submit a 500-word essay OR 3-minute video
14- to 19-year-old applicants will submit a 750-word essay OR a 4-minute video

Grants Applications will be reviewed as they are submitted. Grants will be awarded throughout the year to accommodate all Fair and Project schedules each year. Not purchasing your pig for a couple months? You can still submit your application TODAY! Remember, there are only 20 \$500 Grants are available!

The Arizona Pork Council will mail Grant Checks once recipients have purchased their pig.

Recipients will need to complete a short questionnaire and provide a picture of the youth with their purchased pig prior to checks being mailed.

JAMES 4-H CAMP WORK WEEKEND

APRIL 22-24 2022

Spend Earth Day April 22 at the James 4-H Camp. Come for one day or make it a weekend getaway April 22-24. *The date change is due to low morning temperatures and the potential of freezing pipes*

Projects will be large and small, skilled, and unskilled:

- Cabin preparation sweep bunk boxes, wipe down mattresses, sweep floors, clean windows/sills, wash windows
- Trim weeds around buildings
- Rake 10 feet back around each building.
- Clean Bathhouse
- Clean and set up Dining Hall, repaint dining room tables, organize kitchen
- Gather and stack firewood, sort, and place in fire storage area (tinder, kindling, fuel)
- Paint Exterior Recreation Hall and cabins, re-paint signs
- Assemble new picnic tables, stain, and varnish new and old tables, log bench placement
- Trail work
- Gaga ball re-build
- Repair Frisbee Golf and Orienteering Course markers
- Change batteries in smoke detectors
- Sweep courts, replace volleyball court lines, set up the net
- Set up/prepare archery range
- Challenge course work some projects will require carpentry skills
- Prepare boats, check for damage, set up fishing equipment
- Skilled projects may include framing, insulation, drywall, plumbing, electrical, flooring, gutter installation and building a deck for the new cabin.

On the More Info/Parents & Youth page, you'll find help documents detailing the steps to getting your YQCA web-based training certification, and test-out certification. You'll notice a major change to the account structure – the opportunity to create a parent account and add children, essentially creating one family account for all your YQCA needs.

Parents/youth, if you have a current and valid YQCA certification that you downloaded and saved, please follow these steps to get yourself set up on the new site. YQCA will be manually verifying these current and valid certifications, so please have patience; we will get your certification verified as quickly as possible.

When using the help button, select a support request category that best suits your support requests and then hit "Compose". If the pop-up doesn't work on your machine, use your email program to reach out directly to help@yqcaprogram.org and make the subject line a title from the support request category dropdown list.

TALK ABOUTS

Read, <u>"Insects and Spiders"</u> by George Else or <u>"On Beyond Bugs: All About</u> Insects" by Dr. Seuss

- How are some insects different from other insects?
- What do insects always have?
- Some animals do not have bones inside their bodies. They have a hard shell covering instead. What is this shell called?
- What are the three body sections of
- What are the six most common groups of insects?

Insect Model

Using an assortment of bottle caps, egg cartons, styrofoam balls, buttons, pipe cleaners, clay dough, yarn, cotton balls, etc. allow time for the children to make insect models.

Crickets and Bugs

- Divide the children into two teamsthe Bugs and the Crickets.
- Choose a leader for each team.
- Make two goal lines about 25 yards apart.
- Have each team stand at their goal line, and have the Bugs stand with their backs to the Crickets.
- The Crickets should then silently creep up on the Bugs and stand behind them.
- Then the leader of the crickets calls out, "Run, Crickets, run!"
- The Crickets hurry back to their goal line and the Bugs turn around and chase them.
- Then they switch, have the teams take turns chasing each other until all of the children have had a turn being the leader.

Busy Bee Game

- You need an odd number of children for this game.
- Each child has a partner except for one player who is "It".
- "It" waits while partners scatter and the leader calls out various commands, such as "Back to back," "Face each other," "Shake hands," "Flap your wings".
- When the leader calls out "Busy Bee!" everyone has to get a new partner, including the child who is "It".
- The child who does not find a new partner becomes the new "It".
- Play until everyone has a turn being "It".
