If you were a 4-H member, family, or volunteer last year, we want and need to hear from you!!!

As you know, 4-H youth are asked to complete a project, reflect on their successes and challenges, and then apply those lessons to their project work the following year: Do. Reflect. Apply. This same process is important for improvement in all areas. To ensure Arizona 4-H follows this same process, and continually improves, annual 4-H program evaluations for 4-H youth members and caring adults have been established.

Evaluation is an important part of program planning. It generates data to explain what outcomes occurred and informs future program goals. For 4-H, it is important to be able to explain the value of participation and tell the story of the impact 4-H is making, as well as identify areas where efforts must be invested to make the best better.

All feedback is important! We are asking for <u>each</u> 4-H youth member and <u>each</u> caring adult in the home to fill out the survey from their own perspective. The survey should take about 10 minutes to complete.

This will be a carrying case show, open to all 4-H members Age 8 - 19, prior to January 1, 2022 Enrolled in Rabbit, Cavy, Poultry, Pigeon and Waterfowl. All animals must be tattooed, tagged, or banded.

SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST in Rabbits, Cavy, Poultry, Pigeon and Waterfowl for Senior, Intermediate and Junior members.

Arizona 4-H Showmanship standards will be used. A Round-Robin Championship will be held following the contest. **Required attire for both days** (4-H Showmanship Dress; long sleeved buttoned shirt, closed toed shoes, clean and presentable, club / vests are acceptable)

Best of Variety, Blue, Red, and White Ribbons to be awarded.

Animals may be shown by the 4-H owner or a 4-H assistant in conformation classes.

Submit 2019 or 2020 PSAT scores

You may be eligible if you:

- Are an Arizona resident and a current senior at an accredited Arizona high school
- Will be a first-generation college student (neither parent, stepparent, or legal guardian holds a four-year degree)
- Have a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA (weighted or unweighted) AND minimum test scores of 1110 SAT, 22 ACT, 72 CLT, or 1050 PSAT (PSAT scores taken during your sophomore or junior year)
- Demonstrate financial need by completing the FAFSA
- Are accepted by one of Arizona's three state universities and agree to live in on-campus housing during freshman and sophomore year

GAME "TASTES LIKE...": Healthy Lifestyle



MATERIALS NEEDED:

- Blindfold
- Samples of healthy foods such as grapes, carrots, banana slices, apples slices, cheese, whole grain bread, celery, nuts, and pretzels
- CAUTION: beware of allergens and make substitutions as needed.



APPLICATION:

- What are some snacks you would want from the grocery store?



BOOKS TO READ:

My Food, Your Food, Our Food, by Emma Carlson Berne *The Berenstain Bears and Too Much Junk Food,* by Stan and Jan Berenstain

WHAT TO DO:

- 1. Place food samples on a tray so everyone can see them.
- 2. Blindfold first participant and give them a sample taste.
- Ask what the food is and then which food group it belongs (vegetable, fruit, grain, protein, or diary)
- 4. Let everyone have a turn.
