AWARDS INFORMATION:

State Contest awards will be given to top places in Public Speaking, Individual and Team Demonstration.

State Contest awards will be given for High Scoring Teams and top 10 overall individuals in Horse Bowl and Hippology.

IMPORTANT:

Western National Roundup Competition teams for Hippology (4 members) and Horse Bowl (4 team members and 1 alternate) will be made up from the overall high scores earned by individuals in each contest.

If one of these members are not able to attend WNR the next high scoring competitor will be notified, this process will continue until the teams are filled.

Top 10 competitors from Hippology and Horse Bowl will be invited to participate in study groups and a minimum of 10 practice sessions to prepare for national competition (these will be a combination of in person, online or web meeting).
