Other parents came up at the end of the meeting and quietly dropped money on the table in front of the club Treasurer, "for Junior" they said as they filed out of the room.



Golden Rule Dairy Field Trip

On November 12th, while most students had the day off from school, many of our Pima County's 4-H Dairy Cattle Project members spent their day off visiting a local raw milk dairy. Project members, family members, and project leaders all drove down together to Golden Rule Dairy in Elfrida, AZ, where Jared and Joyce Strite, along with their children graciously welcomed us and shared their work. Jared and Joyce gave us a tour of

their Grade A licensed dairy, sharing a great wealth of knowledge about how to manage a small-scale, family dairy business, including how they feed, breed, and milk their Jersey cows, and finally, bottle their product.

They also shared the challenges and joys of being able to provide wholesome, healthy dairy products through local farmer's markets and specialty grocery stores. The tour was full of information that was beneficial to our members as they also work to raise healthy dairy animals. That said, probably the most exciting part was when Joyce emerged from the house with homemade ice cream topped with home grown raspberry sauce. It was a perfect ending to a perfectly sweet and joyous day. We were so grateful for the opportunity to learn and share time together.
