What is 4-H council? 4-H Council according to article II, section 1 in the bylaw states "The objectives of this council shall be to promote high quality 4-H work within the county; to develop cooperative effort for work, fun and fellowship among leaders and members; to provide opportunity for leadership in the educational economic and social development of the

Thirdly, it is to provide community building, education, and leadership opportunities without discrimination.

Who can join the council? According to article III, section 1, and section 2, "This council shall include all certified leaders, junior leaders in good standing, and the county extension 4-H personnel. Memberships may be extended to any other persons or organizations selected by the board of directors."
