

<u>WHAT</u>: This program provides training to community members who will become community volunteers to assist Cooperative Extension in sharing current, science-based horticultural knowledge with others in their communities.

- Complete 16 classes
- Volunteer 50 hours within 13 months of training to reach certification

- Planting, Staking, and Pruning
- Vegetables and Annuals

- Pesticide Safety
- Native Plants
- Weed Management
