



POULTRY SHOW

REQUIREMENTS:

Exhibitors are encouraged to show only their best exhibits. All breeds accepted by the American Poultry Association, and the American Bantam Association, as stated in the Standard of Perfection, may be exhibited. Exhibitors must use their own exhibit in the showmanship competition. Showmanship exhibits must also be entered in the breed show, or in another judged lot.

HEALTH RULES:

All animals exhibited must be in good health. No animal showing evidence of disease will be accepted and will be required to leave the grounds. Any animal showing evidence of disease, parasites (i.e. lice, nits), infestation, or deformation may be excused from the grounds at the discretion of the committee. Entry fees will not be refunded. **THE DECISION OF THE SHOW COMMITTEE WILL BE FINAL.**

CHECK-IN AND DISPLAY REQUIREMENTS:

1. Each animal will be visually inspected by a committee member prior to cage assignment.
2. Exhibits must have been banded and correspond band numbers to entry form. NOTE: Bands must include a number. Colored bands (i.e. bands without numbers) are not acceptable.
3. Herdsmanship is the responsibility of each and every exhibitor. This includes but is not limited to: participation, interaction with others, cleanliness and care of project animals, cleanliness of stalls and barn aisles, etc.

GROOMING:

1. Exhibitors must adhere to the event dress code.

EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. The owner/exhibitor will take responsibility for the wellness and care of that animal(s) for the duration of the fair.
2. Parental assistance is limited.
3. At all times, exhibition livestock shall be treated in a humane manner so as to protect the health, safety and welfare of the livestock.
