



PYGMY GOAT SHOW

OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

The exhibitor must provide proof of ownership as per the Arizona State Livestock Board requirements for the Seasonal Pass Self Inspection Certificate. Ownership and/or registration papers must be in the exhibitor's name or family herd name. All documentation is due at time of show entry and must be presented at check in. Ownership paperwork must consist of the following:

1. For registered does, the original NPGA "Certificate of Registry" must be available.
2. For registered wethers, the original NPGA "Certificate of Recorded Ancestry" will be used.
3. For unregistered goats less than 2 months old shown in the Prospect Class, the NPGA Breeding Memorandum shall be used to verify ownership.
4. Either a Microchip or Tattoo is required for all goats two months older. If microchipped the number must be printed on the original NPGA registration/record ancestry certificate.

HEALTH RULES:

No animal showing evidence of disease, skin ailments, and/or parasites will be accepted and will be required to leave the grounds. Entry fees will not be refunded. All pygmy goats should be current on the CDT vaccination within six months. **THE DECISION OF THE SHOW COMMITTEE WILL BE FINAL.**

CHECK-IN AND DISPLAY REQUIREMENTS:

1. All Animals must be inspected by a committee member prior to penning in the barn.
2. All seasonal pass self-inspection certificates and supporting documents must be provided to committee member to verify animals' identification upon inspection.
3. Herdsmanship is the responsibility of each and every exhibitor. This includes but is not limited to: participation, interaction with others, cleanliness and care of project animals, cleanliness of stalls and barn aisles, etc.

GROOMING:

1. No horned goats will be permitted. Scurs are allowed if less than one inch. Longer scurs may be permitted if they are curled back or in such a manner that they don't pose a hazard in the opinion of the committee.

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PYGMY GOAT CLASS INFORMATION:



Class 1: Showmanship

- Lot 1: Junior
- Lot 2: Intermediate
- Lot 3: Senior

Class 2: Wethers

- Lot 1: Baby: under 3 months
- Lot 2: Junior: 3 months to less than 6 months
- Lot 3: Intermediate: 6 months to less than 9 months
- Lot 4: Senior: 9 months to less than 12 months
- Lot 5: One Year Old
- Lot 6: Two Years Old
- Lot 7: Three Years and older

Class 3: Registered Doe - Junior Division

- Lot 1: Baby Doe Kids: under 3 months
- Lot 2: Junior Doe Kids: 3 months to less than 6 months
- Lot 3: Intermediate Doe Kids: 6 months to less than 9 months
- Lot 4: Senior Doe Kids: 9 months to less than 12 months
- Lot 5: Junior Dry Yearlings: 12 months to less than 16 months (doe has never kidded)
- Lot 6: Intermediate Dry Yearlings: 16 months to less than 20 months (doe has never kidded)
- Lot 7: Senior Dry Yearling: 20 months to less than 24 months (doe has never kidded)

Class 4: Registered Doe - Senior Division

- Lot 1: Freshened Yearlings 12 months to under 24 months (have kidded but do not need to be in milk)
- Lot 2: Two-year-old does
- Lot 3: Three-Year-old does
- Lot 4: Four Years and older

Class 5: Unregistered Doe Class

- Lot 1: Under 3 months
- Lot 2: 3 months to 6 months
- Lot 3: 6 months to 1 year
- Lot 4: 1 year and over
