THINGS TO KNOW

4-H Enrollment Deadline Nov 1, 2021 by 5pm

Enrollment through ZingBooks (4h.zsuite.org) is now open. It is very important that you select all projects you want for the current year and delete any that you will not be doing this year that you did last year. All 4-H enrollments **MUST** be completed to be eligible to participate in the La Paz County Fair. If your enrollment is not completed before the deadline, you will **NOT** be eligible to participate in the La Paz County Fair.

Club Financials **DUE has been extended until December**

Club leaders don't forget that club financials date has been changed. Please have your Financial Report packet as well as your Long-Term Spending sheet completed and turned into the office before the deadline.

Insurance

Insurance is available for purchase for all large animals. This is a death policy. All insured members must be current 4-H/FFA members. Insurance will only reimburse the cost of the animal. You will need a copy of Bill of Sale and Completed Farm Bureau Insurance form. You may get insurance on multiple animals. Insurance is only required if you get a youth loan, but it is highly recommended to cover costs in case of death of your animal. Please reach out to your club leader or here at the office for an insurance form.

Steer Ear Tag Oct 16th From 8:00 to 10:00 at the Fair grounds

All animals must have a seasonal pass, bill of sale (which includes date of animal purchase) and ownership form signed by parent, leader, and youth completed prior to coming to the Fair grounds. Both market and Carcass steers must be tagged on this day.
