•No special activities need to be planned since these youth want to experience American culture,

- make new friends, and improve their English by staying with your family
- •This is a voluntary program; no stipends will be provided
- •You don't need to be involved with 4-H to host

Shooting Sports – Falconry Demonstration



On April 14, 2019, the Cochise County 4-H Shooting Sports club held a falconry demonstration at the Hart's Shooting Range in Willcox. Cheryl McLaughlin and her Harris Hawk, Culley, visited to introduce the art of falconry to 4-H members and family present. She talked about falconry being both for hunting and a form of conservation and credited falconry programs for saving the Peregrine Falcon population. This raptor was once endangered, but the population has surged in recent years due to people involved in Falconry and is no longer on the endangered list. We are attempting to have her come back in November and give us another demonstration, after the molting season. Record books for county competition are due by Thursday, October 20th.

Tagging Deadlines - Market/Carcass Goat/Sheep/Swine



Official verification will include an ear tag and declaration as to 4-H, FFA or Cochise County Fair Association Other Youth (in which the animal will be shown at the fair). Tags will be provided to Clubs/Chapters/Individuals for application/distribution. Verification forms must be submitted by the deadline of July 4th. There will be no county wide tagging locations.

Please see attached letter from Cochise County Fair Association for more information about the new "Other Youth" Enrollment and Tagging information.

Forms (including bred & fed forms) must be submitted to the Extension office by July 4th

Official verification process.

- 1. Clubs/Chapters/Individuals will notify the Extension office of how many tags they will need.
- 2. Each exhibitor may tag up to 4 animals per species,
- 3. but may only enter and show 1 carcass and 2 market animals at the fair.
- 4. One verification form per Club/Chapter/Individual including member name, species, tag number, 4-H, FFA or Cochise County Other Youth designation, and if qualified for Cochise County Bred &Fed.
- 5. Tag All market/carcass animals must have an official Cochise County large stock tag that will be used on the verification form and entries. Tags will be provided to Clubs/Chapters/Individuals for application/ distribution.

Exhibitors must have a seasonal pass for your animals to exhibit at the fair and other large stock shows. Seasonal Pass forms can be found at the Arizona Department of Ag site: <u>https://agriculture.az.gov/animals/animal-services-inspections/livestock-inspections/seasonal-passes</u>

Enrollment must be complete by May 10th no later than 3:00pm and all beef market projects must be tagged by that date as well. Beef tags can be picked up at the 4-H Cooperative Extension Office in Willcox at 450 S. Haskell Ave, Ste A, Willcox, 85643.

Cochise County Fair announces changes, news for 2019

The Cochise County Fair Association (CCFA) has announced that the livestock auction at the 2019 Cochise County Fair will take place on Saturday, Sept. 28 at the fairgrounds in Douglas. In previous years, the auction took place on Sunday, the last day of the fair. Specific times will be announced at a later date. Dates of the 2019 fair are Thursday, Sept. 26-Sunday, Sept. 29.

In addition, after extensive discussions and study, the fair association has elected to work in cooperation with the University of Arizona Cooperative Extension to manage exhibit entries, auctions and volunteers. In accordance with IRS rules governing the University of Arizona and non-profit organizations, it also will process auction payments, communications and associated tax forms. As a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, the association will fill this role now that the University of Arizona Cooperative Extension is no longer handling financial aspects of the exhibits and sale.

Fair board member and long-time auction volunteer Tony Fraze has been appointed to lead the auction committee. The association seeks past and potential volunteers to assist in ensuring a quality experience for youth exhibitors. Members of 4-H who expect to exhibit at the 2019 fair will find the 4-H Rule Book on the UA Cooperative Extension website at <u>https://extension.arizona.edu/4h/cochise</u>. Rules for the small and large stock auctions are being finalized in partnership with the University of Arizona and will be governed by the Cochise County Fair Association and posted on the fair association website at <u>www.cochiscountyfair.org</u> as soon as they become available.

The theme for the 2019 fair is "Cochise County May be a Square, but Not Our County Fair." It was proposed by Huachuca City School student Joshua Givens and chosen from entries in a contest run by the Cochise County School Superintendent's Office. The education exhibits will reflect this theme.
