#### 4-H Enrollment Deadline Nov 1, 5pm

Enrollment through ZingBooks (4h.zsuite.org) opened August 1st. All 4-H enrollments MUST be completed to be eligible to participate in the La Paz County Fair. If your enrollment is not completed before the deadline, you will NOT be eligible to participate in the La Paz County Fair.

#### Club Financials DUE Dec 31st

#### USDA 4-H Project Loans

It is a federal loan and failure to pay the loan back will result in delinquency and will affect you when you apply for student loans or when you complete your income taxes.
