TRICH AND YOUR CATTLE HERD

WHY YOU SHOULD BE TESTING YOUR BULLS



TRICHOMONIASIS (TRICH): IS A SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASE IN CATTLE. THE DISEASE IS CAUSED BY A MICROSCOPIC BUG THAT LIVES IN THE REPRODUCTIVE TRACT



\$400 profit loss



Up to 50% calf crop loss



<u>ALWAYS</u> test your bulls before and after the breeding season!

Selling a bull?

State law requires any bull coming into or traveling out of AZ to be tested. Tests are valid for 30 days for out of state change of ownership, and 60 days for in-state change of ownership. Accredited veterinarians can be found at https://vsapps.aphis.usda.gov/vsps/public/VetSearch.do



Your bulls test positive, now what?

Communicate with your veterinarian and follow their instructions. Immediately isolate all your bulls from the herd. Inform your neighbors incase bulls were crossing fences. 97% of cows can clean up after 3 - 5 heat cycles, but 3% of cows can become carriers and reinfect new bulls. There are no treatments for trich positive animals.
