Spice It Up!

Yavapai County Extension Program Coordinator and trained Chef, Aimee Novak along with Coconino County Extension Master Gardener in training, Andrea Neis, collaborate to provide a free food demonstration called "Spice It Up!". They will demonstrate how to cook with fresh herbs and spices and provide tips on growing a home herb garden.



During this two-hour presentation, Aimee Novak demonstrates tips and tricks for creating customized spice blends, using herb sachets for seasoning, and how spices enhance food flavor. Andrea Neis will present ideas and information about growing edible herbs in the home garden, including reasons for growing herbs, the difference between annual, perennial, and biennial herbs, planting throughout the seasons, and considerations when planning an herb garden.
