## **Garden History**

Since purchasing my home in 1985, I have been changing the very mid-century lot into a more personal and welcoming environment. I want my garden to express my quirky personality.

## **Gardening Basics**

**Watering:** I have begun to limit high water use plants. I harvest rainwater and use gray water from my washer and evaporative cooler. I hand water using Tucson city water.

**Soil:** There is a lot of caliche and compacted earth, which I have battled for many years. I have added compost and other soil amendments to help my suffering plants.

**Fertilizer:** Currently I am using Mesquite Valley Growers Special Blend. I also use Arizona Best Citrus fertilizer. I have used Miracle Grow, but have not had great luck with it.

**Pest Control:** I have had problems with grubs and have tried different products. Currently, I am using compost tea with nematodes from Arbico.

**Gardening Philosophy:** I have been influenced by the Spanish patio concept with the heartbeat of the garden being the Buddha fountain. I use color and lush plantings to create a peaceful, cool, out-of-doors living space.
