



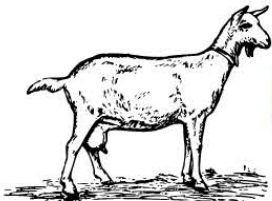
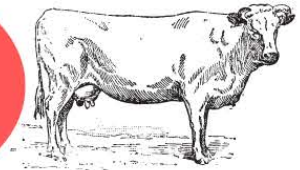

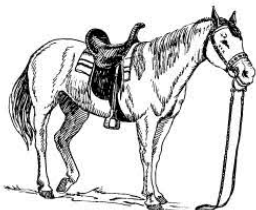
## HELP! I Think My Animal Ate A Poisonous Plant. What Should I Do?

**1. Take a deep breath. Assess your animal for any signs or symptoms of illness. Immediately call your veterinarian.**



**2. Take samples of the plant to show your veterinarian. If that is not possible, take very clear pictures of the plant.**

**3. Provide comfort care for your animal until the veterinarian arrives. Put them in a safe stall or place and monitor them.**



**4. Follow all veterinarian instructions. After the emergency, evaluate your grazing areas or pastures for additional toxic plants.**
