



AAI 1.0 provides highly interactive, multi-day tours designed to teach educators about food and fiber production and to help them incorporate that knowledge in the classroom. AAI combines hands-on learning about agriculture with practical curriculum development. Participants receive continuing education units or professional development hours (CEUs, PD) and free classroom materials that are aligned to Arizona's Academic Standards. AAI 1.0 is an annual program held over the summer in Maricopa County.

### **MARICOPA COUNTY AG**

This summer, 18 teachers joined the University of Arizona Cooperative Extension's Agricultural Literacy program and the Arizona Foundation for Agricultural Literacy for the Arizona Agricultural Institute (AAI) 1.0 in Maricopa County, Arizona. Teachers were able to see the vast array of agricultural production, research, and commodities found in Arizona. We started our week off with a half day of virtual farm tours and followed it with three packed in-person tours. Teachers had the opportunity to network with each other, industry representatives, farmers, researchers, and the AFAL board members and staff.

### **IMPACT**



Eighteen teachers from 5 of Arizona's 15 counties, who teach over 2,500 students annually, attended AAI 1.0 this summer. Pre- and postsurveys were conducted to measure the participants' change in knowledge in several areas, including dairy and beef operations, vermicompost, grain production, flour milling, agricultural worker conditions, cotton production, and water conservation. In all areas surveyed, an increase in knowledge occurred.
