HELP YOUR CHILDREN GET READY TO READ BY EXPLORING BOOKS



- Show your children the different parts of a book: the cover, author, illustrator, title, pages, words, and pictures.
- Showing your children the different parts of a book will help them understand how to use books and that books contain words and words have meaning.

Let Children of All Ages Explore Books.

Infants (children who are about 0-12 months old)

- o Let infants hold and explore books.
- o Help them figure out how the pages work.
- o It's okay if they put them in their mouths.
- o Try using a sturdy board book with thick pages that are hard to tear.

Toddlers (children who are about 1-3 years old)

- o Show toddlers the different parts of the book including the cover, title, pages, words and pictures.
- o Tell them that the author writes the book and the illustrator draws the pictures.
- o Show them where to find the names of the author and illustrator on the front cover.

Preschoolers (children who are about 1-3 years old)

- o Show preschoolers that we read from left to right and that words are separated by spaces.
- o As you read, point to the words you are reading.
- o Ask your preschooler to point out the different parts of the book. Ask them: Where is the cover? Where is the author's name?
