Finding Children's Books that Celebrate Indigenous People & Cultures

LOOK FOR BOOKS THAT:

- are written and illustrated by indigenous people,
- feature indigenous people in a positive light (rather than perpetuating stereotypes),
- feature an indigenous person as a main character (rather than a supporting character),
- feature indigenous people in a range of settings (as a hero, in everyday life, in the present day, in an historical setting, etc.), and
- include "indigenous characters who demonstrate the ability to achieve success on their own terms and in the context of their cultures or communities, as successful problem-solvers independent of non-Native teachers, social workers, and other authority figures."
