Ace 55VF: (ACE) – Heirloom, Determinate, was originally developed for the commercial market of the 1950's, and soon found favor with home gardeners. Noted for its tasty balance of sugar and acid, it also has superior disease resistance. Days to maturity - 55.



Amish Paste: (AP) – Heirloom, Indeterminate. Large sauce tomato; slightly irregular plum to strawberry-shaped fruits; avg. 2 oz. with excellent flavor. These meaty tomatoes are good in salads and great for processing. 80 Days. 2021 stats: 15 lbs./plant @ 2oz

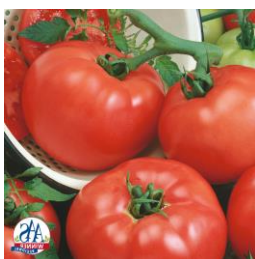


Bloody Butcher: (BB) – Heirloom, Indeterminate, 55 Days - A sensational, multi-purpose tomato, very early and high yielding. Strong tomato flavor. Medium-round 1-2 oz. fruits that are a deep dark, red inside, and out. Potato-leaf shape and are fast growing. Our 2019 stats: Avg 15 lbs./plant

BW: (BW) – Hybrid, Indeterminate. Produces a red 6-ounce fruit. Takes a long time to ripen. 90 days to maturity. Very tasty slicer. Our 2021 stats: 13 lbs./plant @ 3-4 oz.



Chef's Choice Red: (CCR) - Hybrid VFF: Indeterminate, 80 days. (CCR) (1-10E, 1-2E) Fifth color in the Chef's Choice series to win an AAS Award, attesting to its unrivaled flavor and unmatched adaptability. It has an unusually good balance of sweet yet tangy taste to yield that fabulous, old-fashioned tomato flavor! Round, smooth, 6 to 7-in., 8-oz., firm fruits from dark green, disease-resistant vines.



Creole Original: (CO) – Heirloom, indeterminate, 70 days, The seeds trace back to the late 1700s. We have yet to verify this amazing heritage; however, we have verified the amazing potential of this wonderful variety. Medium sized fruits ripen to a nice bright red color. Yields are large and production lasts late into the season. Avg 10 lbs./plant & 3 oz,



Celebrity: (CEL) – Hybrid, semi-determinate, 70 days. The most disease-resistant tomato of all enjoys great versatility in all types of growing conditions. This highly publicized AAS Winner captured the home garden and commercial market spotlight long ago and remains the benchmark of success. Deeply oblate 8-oz. fruits ripen to bright red on medium sized plants. Our 2021 stats: Avgs:12 lbs./plant @ 4-6 oz/tom.



Druzba: (DRU) – Heirloom, Indeterminate from Bulgaria, this variety bears large harvests of perfectly smooth and round, deep-red tomatoes that weigh between 4 - 6oz. Flavor is outstanding, with just the right combination of sweetness and tartness, and fruit is juicy and blemish-free; 2021 stats: 10 lbs./plant @ 3 oz/tom

8/9/20 (Brix=6)



Gardener's Delight: (GD) – Heirloom, indeterminate; German, 65 days. Bright red, Cherry tomato. Sweet fruits, full of flavor. This produces many clusters of 6 to 12, ½ oz. cherry tomatoes all summer

long. It's crack resistant and very prolific. Proven to have high performance, flavor and wide adaptability. AVG: 28 lbs./plant



Garden Gem: (GG) – Hybrid, Semi-determinate plant, 55 days to maturity. produces large amounts of elongated red 2-2.5-ounce fruits. An excellent tasting tomato that's great in sauces. Our 2021 stats: 14 lbs./plant avg. @ 2.5 oz.



Garden Ruby: (GR) – Hybrid, semi-determinate, 70 days. Produces a large number of medium round deep red 6 oz. fruits. The fruits have a higher lycopene content than normal tomatoes. These plants are resistant to gray leaf spot, Phytophthora Race 3, Fusarium wilt - Races 0, 1 and 2.



Garden Treasure: (GT) – Hybrid, indeterminate, 70 days. Produces large round red 8-ounce fruits with vastly better yields, increased firmness, and taste. The Garden Treasure is resistant to gray leaf spot, late blight, and Fusarium wilt Races 1 & 2.



Moskvich: (MOS) – Heirloom, Semi-determinate, 60 days. One of the most appealing extra-early tomatoes. Fruits are early, deep red, and cold tolerant. Rich flavor. Smooth and globe shaped. 4-6 oz. with a small stem scar. USDA Certified Organic.



NICHOLS: (NI) – Tucson Heirloom, Indeterminate , 70 Days. This rugged tomato was cultivated 50 years ago, by the Nichols family of the Arizona desert. Drought tolerant. First fruits form from mid to late season, and they can tolerate colder nights more than others. A refreshing flavored tomato, it's perfect for processing in drought prone areas; salads are perhaps the best setting for these. The long shelf life of this cultivar has no bearing on its texture, its thin skin, or firm flesh.



Punta Banda: (PB) – Heirloom, indeterminate, 68 days. Collected from the Baja Peninsula in California, it produces hundreds of red meaty, thick skinned fruits despite heat, water stress and poor soil. Great paste tomato. Prolific producer throughout the summer despite full exposure and harsh conditions. It was incredibly productive in 2018 at Mission Garden. Renowned for its early maturity.



R-Hybrid: (RH) - Hybrid, indeterminate, 60 days. This variety produces a large amount of red one-ounce, tasty bite-sized fruits. It is a very prolific vine.



Rutgers: (RU) – Heirloom (VFAST), determinate, 75 Days. All-purpose variety, ideal for canning. Ripens evenly from inside out. Bright red fruits with heavy walls average about 7 oz. Attractive, old-time favorite. Full-bodied flavor and disease resistant.



Tomato Liguria: (TL) – Heirloom, Indeterminate, 80-day. A tomato variety "heart of beef" that is very productive. It is fleshy; it contains little juice and seeds. An exceptionally sweet taste: ideal for sauces... Our 2021 stats: 8 lbs./plant @ 3-4 oz.



Yellow Pear: (YP) – Heirloom, Indeterminate, 70 days. These produce huge, bushy plants that yield very large quantities of 1 oz., 1 1/2-inch, bright yellow, pear-shaped cherry tomatoes that produce fruit until frost.
